

Duty Under the Law

Under the terms of KRS 15.257 concerning the open records and open meetings laws, the form was completed by Police Chief Redman, Commissioner Kuster, Commissioner Hardin, and Commissioner Renninger and given to the clerk.

The Statements of Financial Interest are to be completed by all city officials and given to resident Jeri Heck who volunteered to be responsible for keeping on file and to provide on demand when required by law.

Minutes for Meeting on December 9, 2010

Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

John Price read the treasurer's report for December, 2010 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Hardin made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Renninger. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for December, 2010 were then read by John Price, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to approve payment of the warrants, which was seconded by Commissioner Price. The warrants were approved unopposed.

Police Report

Police Chief Redman reported as follows:

-345 police coverage hours from 12/9/10 to 1/13/11,
-1 arrest,
-1 citation,
-13 suspicious persons,
-160 house watches,
-11 traffic stops,
-6 dispatched runs,
-240 police/public contacts
-4 reports;

-Robbery 1st degree, 4500 Block of Taylorsville Rd,
-Assault 1st degree, 1600 Block of Hunnington Pl,
-Criminal attempt theft from auto, Cardwell Way 8,
-Accident, 1700 Block of Somerset.

In other news, a convicted sex offender was found living within 1000 ft. of the city park, 1608 Hunnington Place, #9. Our Police Department is working with the apartment complex to encourage him to move out of our city. There was a domestic violence/drug arrest made by LMPD in the 1700 Block of Somerset. Our Police Department is following up with that arrest. Officer Bittle continues to work on the compilation of an emergency contact list with Hurstbourne Acres businesses. Finally, regarding the House Watch program, Police Chief Redman received a letter of thanks from a resident for the way our city had followed up with her when she was away.

Attorney's Report

Attorney Stewart had nothing to report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Hardin reported that everything was fine in the park, including the flag on the flag pole. It was suggested by Police Chief Redman that the city meetings begin with the Pledge of Allegiance. After discussion, Commissioner Hardin made a motion to purchase another flag for that purpose, not to exceed \$100. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kuster and passed unanimously.

Sanitation

Commissioner Renninger advised that four residences with backdoor service were missed this past period, but had since been resolved. The city received thanks from the Skaggs family.

OLD BUSINESS

Grant Update

Commissioner Renninger reported on 4 grants. Previous Commissioner Dunn had applied for the Kentucky Litter Grant for which we received \$764.07 in January, 2010. A follow-up report was required, which was prepared and sent on January 12, 2011. The second grant was received from Homeland Security for MDTs (police computers) in the amount of \$10,000. The quarterly report for that grant had been completed by Sergeant Skaggs. Grant #3 is for the new 800 megahertz radio system which is now being used by Metro Safe. This grant was for \$19,000, and the quarterly report is being completed by Sergeant Skaggs. The fourth grant, for which we have only applied, is the Kentucky League of Cities Safety Grant. This is a matching grant for which the city can receive up to \$3,000.

Snow Removal

In answer to a concern about the last response from our service provider who handles snow removal, Mayor Fore advised that he made the call. Until this duty is assigned to a commissioner, he will determine when to have them service our roads during a snow fall.

Alcohol Consumption in the Park Ordinance

After discussion, it was agreed that an ordinance to restrict the consumption of alcohol in the park was unnecessary, and no further action would be taken.

Hazardous Material Disposal

Commissioner Hardin is still working on developing a program through Metro Council Member Jon Ackerson's office which can be used by our residents.

NEW BUSINESS

Procurement Ordinance, First Reading

After a brief explanation by Mayor Fore of the bill payment policy to be adopted by our city, Commissioner Hardin made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #1, Series 2011 establishing a procurement policy for Hurstbourne Acres. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, and passed unopposed. Mayor Fore then completed the first reading.

Metro Partnership Program Resolution

Mayor Fore read Resolution #1, Series 2011 which allows the City of Hurstbourne Acres to participate in the program for capital improvement projects. This is in response to the enactment of Ordinance #110, Series 2006, Section 97.100 by Louisville Jefferson County Metro Government Council which is a Metro Partnership program with suburban cities. The resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote.

New Website Manager

After approval by the City Commission, it was announced that Jason Tretter will take over the management and redevelopment of the city's website. Commissioner Renninger said that she would work with Jason to provide some ideas for the website. Thanks were given to Josh Price who originally developed and maintained it.

Cameras

Last month, it was reported that a new video in-car camera system was awarded to our Police Department by Highway Safety in a raffle valued at \$6000. Police Chief Redman reported that since our city would never use this system, he has returned it to Kentucky Department of Transportation. In consideration of that, our city was given a credit toward equipment that in the future may be of more use to the city.

Cost of Sidewalk

Mayor Fore advised that preliminary calculations indicate that the cost to build a sidewalk which runs from Hurstbourne Lane, continuing in front of Nunnlea to Bunsen Way, would be about \$39,000. We are still in discussions with the current owner of the land.

Street Lights

As mentioned last meeting, our city is working with LG&E to verify the number of street lights belonging to our city compared to the number for which we are being charged.

Executive Session

There being no further business or discussion, a motion was made and carried, pursuant to KRS 61.815, to allow for the Commission to hold an Executive Session, pursuant to KRS 61.810(f), to discuss police personnel. When complete, the regular meeting will be adjourned.
