

I wanted to let the residents know that our city is now operating out of our reserves for the rest of the fiscal year. The present 2010-2011 budget is set to spend approximately \$300,000. Our city has a tax base income of approximately \$150,000 annually, plus we receive another \$60,000-\$70,000 from the state (not guaranteed). The state money comes from different sources. Also, the state part of the money must be used for certain categories, ex: roads, police, etc. I think you should know that the police budget is approximately \$150,000 annual. Our trash pick up is \$54,000 annual. At this pace our reserves will be less than \$700,000 by the end of this June. I figured we will be out of reserves in about 6 years or so. Keep in mind that the 6-year projection is figured in today's economic status and does not include any unforeseen circumstances. So pay attention and get involved. I hope to see you at the next meeting--this Thursday, March 10.



Minutes for Meeting on January 13, 2011

Commissioner Hardin made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed without opposition.

Treasurer's Report

John Price read the treasurer's report for January, 2011 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to approve as read, which was seconded by Commissioner Hardin. The motion passed without opposition.

Warrants

The warrants for January, 2011 were then read by John Price, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After discussion which included Warrant #W11-291 (concerning the purchase of laptop computers for the police), Commissioner Kuster made a motion to amend the Budget Ordinance to accommodate the additional cost. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger which passed unopposed. Commissioner Price made a motion to approve payment of the warrants, which was seconded by Commissioner Kuster. The warrants were approved unopposed. It was noted that Commissioner Hardin abstained from voting on Warrant #299 & 307.

Grant Update

Commissioner Renninger reported that the quarterly reports for the two Homeland Security grants have been completed. The Kentucky League of Cities (KLC) Safety

Grant was written and has been received by KLC. We will hear from KLC in April about this grant.

Police Report

With Police Chief Redman out temporarily due to an 'on duty' injury, no specific data was available on which to report. The report will be provided at next month's meeting.

Attorney's Report

Attorney Stewart reported on 3 ordinances. With the necessary correction to Ordinance #1, Series 2011 (Procurement Procedure), Commissioner Hardin made a motion to have the second reading of the ordinance which was seconded by Commissioner Kuster. The motion passed unanimously. Mayor Fore then completed the reading. Commissioner Hardin made a motion to enact and ordain, seconded by Commissioner Kuster. The motion passed unopposed. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication.

After discussion, Commissioner Hardin made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #2, Series 2011 (Abandonment of Real Property), which was seconded by Commissioner Kuster and passed without opposition. Mayor Fore then completed the reading.

After discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to have the first reading of Ordinance #3, Series 2011 (Satellite Dish Placement). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hardin, which passed unopposed. Mayor Fore then completed the reading.

LG&E Update

There was nothing new to report at this meeting.
