Unsolicited Telephone Calls

If you have been receiving unsolicited telemarketing phone calls and find them annoying. You might want to call the National Do Not Call Registry 1-888-382-1222. You must call from the number you wish to register. You may also register online at www.donotcall.gov.

Exemptions to Kentucky's No Call Law

If your phone number is on the No Call List, telemarketers are restricted from calling you. There are some exemptions to this law;

1. Telemarketers with whom you have a prior or existing business relationship.
2. Telemarketers who have received an express request from you to call.
3. Telemarketers with whom you have an existing debt or contract.
4. Telemarketers soliciting only donations for charities.
5. Telemarketers who call your business.
6. Political calls and telephone surveys or polls.

BE AWARE OF THE DANGERS

- NEVER give out your credit card, bank account, birth date or social security number to a stranger over the phone.
- Consider making it a rule in your home that you do not do business over the telephone.
- Ask that all information be sent to you by mail.
- Remember they called you. Don't be afraid to say NO or to hang up.
- If it sounds too good to be true, it most likely is.

Welcome to New Commission

Mayor Fore welcomed the new Commission which includes 2 new commissioners, Jim Lynch and Lenny Miles.

Minutes for Meeting on December 13, 2012

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Price made a motion to accept as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lynch, and passed unopposed. Commissioner Renninger made a suggestion that we no longer include street numbers in the minutes which was discussed and approved.

Treasurer’s Report

Sharon Hollkamp read the treasurer’s report for December, 2012 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept as outlined by the Treasurer. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Price, and passed without opposition.

Warrants

Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for December, 2012, and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Lynch made a motion to accept as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Renninger, and passed unanimously. Due to recent problems with receiving the city audit on time, Treasurer Hollkamp recommended we put out for bid for new city auditor.

Police Report

Police Officer Randy Bittle reported on the following;
6 traffic stops, 3 citations, 3 warnings, 1 incident of stolen property from vehicle at carwash, 2 house watches, shoplifting issues remain unchanged.

Attorney’s Report

With no representative from the attorney’s office present, there was no report. On past occasions, if the attorney was not present, and there was any issue, a telephone call was placed to John Frith Stewart, or his associate. It subsequently was disclosed that the Attorney had contracted the flu, confining him to bed for a number of days.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Miles reported that the flag in the park was placed at ½ staff following the tragic school shooting in Connecticut on 12/14/12. We are submitting a request before the deadline date of 1/15 for grant money, which will be matched, for playground equipment. Finally, it was mentioned some branches and trash were picked up from the park. He will discuss with Commissioner Price how best to have the park waste removed by Eco-Tech

Sanitation

Commissioner Price has magnets with contact information for Eco-Tech available for anyone who wants one. From a request from Mayor Fore, Commissioner Price explained how the pickup schedule works during holidays. In answer to a question from Commissioner Renninger about backdoor service, it was explained that that service is provided only for those residents who have chosen not to use the cans furnished by Eco-Tech.

Streets & Lights

Commissioner Lynch confirmed that the street light on Wesley has been repaired. 'No Parking' signs for a section of Hurstbourne Circle for use by the City Police Department will be ordered. A door lock at Nunnlea will be fixed. Police Chief Redman contacted Commissioner Lynch about the need to repaint the one-way street lines on Hurstbourne Lane. There is a missing street sign on Wesley which will be replaced. A resident at the meeting mentioned the need to repair a light in front of their home.

Police

Commissioner Renninger advised of the stepped up patrol on Hurstbourne Lane. There was a complaint about the parking of a vehicle at a property on Hurstbourne Circle. It was investigated and determined that no ordinances were being violated.

NEW/OLD BUSINESS

Podcast of Meetings

After a discussion about the possibility of filming and then podcasting our City meetings, the consensus was to drop the suggestion altogether.

Open Records Posting

Per KRS 61.876, the City is required to adopt and post rules and regulations governing open records requests. At the December, 2012 meeting, Commissioner Price gave the City attorney, John F Stewart, a draft for his approval, but has not yet heard back from him. Mayor Fore said that he would contact the attorney tomorrow, and confirm what would satisfy the legal requirements.

Trees on Blowing Tree

Commissioner Price met with Jim Couch, the representative from the Bullitt Trust about the trimming of the fencerow across from properties on Blowing Tree. It was Commissioner Price's understanding that he would help in the cost, but has not had any further contact since the meeting. Mayor Fore said that he would follow up with a letter to Mr. Couch.

Home Ordinance

Officer Bittle confirmed that there is a house on address X (withheld to protect resident privacy) that is sitting vacant in potential violation of a city ordinance. The pertinent ordinance will be reviewed again, but more information is needed. Commissioner Price said she would help get additional information. Once the City has all of the appropriate information and facts, Mayor Fore advised that we would proceed with action against the owner as outlined in the ordinance.

New Commissioner School

In answer to a question from Mayor Fore, Commissioner Miles said that he has already made a reservation to attend. After discussion, Commissioner Renninger made a motion that the City pay for both Lenny Miles and Jim Lynch to attend the Kentucky League of Cities class for new commissioners. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miles, and passed unanimously.

Ordinance Review Commissioner Renninger pointed out that some of the ordinances like the recent Solicitation Ordinance require residents to first get the appropriate county permits.

Mayor Fore advised that at next month's meeting, he will request that the fence and garage ordinances also be amended to add the stipulation that any permits required by the Metro government first be obtained before applying for a permit for our city. Commissioner Renninger also suggested that the cost for the various permits be standardized, and that the City newsletter outline a specific ordinance each month to help residents better understand the ordinances our city has in place.

Zoning/Ordinance Board

Another discussion developed from Commissioner Lynch's question as to when the City will setup the necessary Zoning Board and an Ordinance Review Board. Mayor Fore agreed that the structure needs to be in place to handle future zoning and/or ordinance issues. With J-Town's experience, and in previous meetings with their mayor, Mayor Fore mentioned that they could be used as a resource.

Commissioner Price's suggestion was that the City consider using the accredited, licensed services of an agency on an as-needed basis, such as Forest Hills does.

Survey It was reported that no further progress has been made to obtain a new survey for determining what part of Blowing Tree is part of the City. This is needed to establish what options the City has to resolve the drainage problem previously discussed. Commissioner Price said she would continue to follow up with her contact at MSD, with Commissioner Lynch continuing to review and monitor the situation. Mayor Fore also said that he would contact former Fire Inspector Bill Renninger for help in interpreting the existing survey.

Miscellaneous A resident expressed concern about a mention made in the Newsletter about removing a speed bump on Hurstbourne Lane. With the problem of persons driving the wrong way on Hurstbourne Lane and the effectiveness of the speed bumps in slowing down vehicles, a strong recommendation was made to leave the speed bumps in place. The Commission also confirmed that they are in the process of reviewing a resident's request for a permit to install a satellite dish.

There being no further business or discussion during the regular meeting, Commissioner Renninger made a motion to allow for the Commission to hold an Executive Session, pursuant to KRS 61.810(1)(f), to discuss city personnel. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lynch and passed unopposed. When complete, the regular meeting will be adjourned.

Open Records Regulations

Sally Price brought a copy of KRS 61.874 which states the procedures to follow in requesting City records (furnished by the Kentucky League of Cities). A draft of the City's Open Records Request regulations was given to John Frith Stewart for review, prior to the required accessible posting in City Hall.

John Frith Stewart reminded the Mayor that newly elected Commissioners need to be sworn in, and Mayor Fore said it was his intention to have them sworn in after the meeting.

Traffic on Hurstbourne Lane

A resident on the one-way section of Hurstbourne Lane remarked that traffic going the wrong way has increased significantly in the afternoons. After discussion of possible solutions, it was decided that patrols would be more frequent and that residents as well as cut-through traffic would be ticketed.

After Mayor Fore thanked Dan Kuster and Brent Hardin for their service to the City, the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm.
